Selah

Selah is a word that appears seventy-one times in the Book of Psalms and three times in

Habakkuk. The Hebrew word is not directly translated, but is rather *transliterated* – that is, it is written in English according to the way it sounds when pronounced in the original language. The exact usage and meaning of the word are not known, but it is most likely ...

(1) A break that provides a musical interlude, (2) A word meant to lift up & exalt God, (3) A word to indicate "forever" or "it is so" – comparable to "Amen," (4) A pause at the end of a thought or subject - often marking a transition in the text, (5) A word to prompt "deep reflection" or "solemn contemplation."

The last two of these seem the most probable. And based on context, the last explanation seems to make the most sense, making the word comparable to "meditation." While no one knows exactly what *Selah* means, it appears to be an expression that invites us to worship God and study the Bible more deeply. Much like the word meditation, *Selah* could be a request for the reader to pause and think about what has just been said. It allows an opportunity for us to take a moment and pause from the hectic pace of our busy lives to thoughtfully consider the wonders of God and ponder the deeper spiritual meanings of His holy word.

Paul speaks to this in Colossians 2:2-3. For the Colossians, his desire is "that their hearts may be encouraged, being knit together in love, and attaining to all riches of the full assurance of understanding, to the knowledge of the mystery of God, both of the Father and of Christ, in whom are hidden all the treasures of wisdom and knowledge."

The successful "mining" of these "hidden treasures" – extracting the wisdom and knowledge found in God's word – requires both time and effort. This "effort" is not so much reflected in strenuous exertion, as it is in the tranquil atmosphere of thoughtful contemplation and quiet meditation. In our often frenzied, past-paced, modern-day lives, it will take decisive planning and deliberate preparation in order to set aside the time to sufficiently study and effectively meditate on God's word.

When we see the word *Selah*, it's as if God is saying "Be still and know the I am God!" (Ps 46:10). The Hebrew word translated "be still" means "to be quiet; to sink down and relax; to let go." This is wise and beneficial counsel for 21st century Christians. Taking time to settle down, pray, and meditate on God and His word, is good for the soul and promotes our spiritual well-being. "Blessed are those who keep His testimonies, who seek Him with the whole heart! (Ps 119:2) ... I will meditate on Your precepts, and contemplate Your ways (v. 15) ... Your testimonies are my delight and my counselors" (v. 24).

And there is no better counselor than the word of God. Amen! "For the Lord gives wisdom; from His mouth come knowledge and understanding" (Pr 2:6). God's counsel will not mislead nor disappoint: "He who gets wisdom loves his own soul; he who keeps understanding will find good!" (Pr 19:8). — Terry Schmidt \swarrow
