
"Pray for one another" - James 5:16 -

The Troublesome Ups & Downs of Life

Most likely, many are familiar with the children's game *Chutes*



& Ladders. Starting at "square one" at the bottom of the board, players are required to work through over 90 spaces to reach the last square at the top of the board to win the game. However, at various points, one could land on a ladder (moving his piece upward & forward many spaces (2), or one could encounter a chute (sliding his piece downward & backward many spaces B). So, throughout the game, nothing is certain! And with a simple roll of the dice or spin of the needle, one can quickly find himself either winning or losing. Those lagging behind could land on a ladder which could catapult them to the lead. And those who were in the lead did not have the luxury of bragging because they could be sent backward by landing on a chute at any given time.

This enjoyable child's game seems to mirror the troublesome ups and downs of life which are inevitable and often unpredictable. And much of the time, these vicissitudes of life do not seem fair, nor do they make any sense. We see good things happening to bad people, and bad things happening to good people. There seems to be no real rhyme or reason to this puzzling, frustrating phenomenon. When times are good, there is the human propensity to forget God. And when times are bad, there is the carnal temptation to blame God. What are some helpful, biblical ways you and I can respond during these difficult times when we find ourselves tossed about by tempestuous waves on the capricious sea of life?

First, we can realize that, no matter how bad things seem God is still in control. He is sovereign. That is, "He works all things according to the counsel of His will" (Eph 1:11; Col 1:15-17; 1 Tim 6:15-16). Second, we can remind ourselves that our Lord is constant and changeless. With Him "there is no variation or shadow of turning" (Jas 1:17), and He "is the same yesterday, today and forever" (Heb 13:8). Third, we can take courage in the fact that "God is faithful, by whom you were called into the fellowship of His Son, Jesus Christ our Lord" (1 Cor 1:9; 10:13; 2 Thess 3:3). He is dependable and trustworthy for He has said, "I will *never* leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Heb 13:5). Finally, we can rejoice in the knowledge that our Lord Jesus Christ is victorious! He saved us and called us with a holy calling ... "our Savior Jesus Christ has abolished death and brought life and immortality to light through the gospel" (2 Tim 1:9-10). Yes, "thanks be to God, who gives *us* the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ" (1 Cor 15:50-57).

Jesus acknowledges that in this world we will have problems, persecutions, trials and tribulations. Then he lovingly adds: "But be of good cheer (take heart!), I have overcome the world!" (John 16:33). — Terry Schmidt \swarrow
