#### The Steadfast Love of the Lord

The older I get, the more convinced I become that



fallen man simply does not have the capacity to fully fathom nor completely comprehend the depth and intensity of God's magnanimous love. Try as we might, we will never be able to know or appreciate the full extent of the tremendous love that has been graciously extended to us through Jesus Christ our Lord. To be fair, in our physical human existence, the only tangible point of reference that we have is the love we give *to* others and the love we receive *from* others. And the love generated by human beings certainly pales in comparison to the divine love of God. For the lovingkindness of God is an everlasting love (Jer 31:3).

God Himself declares that His ways are higher than our ways, and His thoughts higher than our thoughts. In describing the noble character of God, the Psalmist affirms: "But You, O Lord, are a God full of compassion, and gracious, longsuffering and abundant in mercy and truth" (Ps 85:15). Each one of these divine characteristics is deeply rooted *in* and inextricably linked *to* the steadfast love of God. And so, we sing: "The steadfast love of the Lord never ceases, His mercies never come to an end; they are new every morning; great is Thy faithfulness!" (Lam 3:22).

As humans, our love toward others tends to diminish when someone hurts, wrongs, or otherwise fails us. Not so with God. "God demonstrates His own love toward us, in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom 5:8). Although He has seen each of us at our worst, God's love remains strong and steadfast. As the Lord Himself attests: "The Lord, the Lord God, [is] merciful and gracious, longsuffering, and abounding in goodness and truth" (Ex 34:6). Paul asks the question, "Who shall separate us from the love of Christ?" He then answers: "I am persuaded that neither death nor life, nor angels nor principalities nor powers, nor things present nor things to come, nor height nor depth, nor any other created thing, shall be able to separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus our Lord" (Rom 8:38-39).

"Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! How unsearchable are His judgments and His ways past finding out!" (Rom 11:33). No, we will not in this life be able to effectively grasp or adequately understand the steadfast love the Lord has for us. But, by faith, we acknowledge and gratefully accept the truth that "God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life" (Jn 3:16). Without Christ, our sins will condemn us to an eternity in hell (Ezek 18:20; Mt 10:28; Mt 25:41; Mk 16:16; Rom 6:23; 2 Thess 1:9; Jude 1:7; Rev 20:14-15).

"But God, who is rich in mercy, <u>because of His great love with which He loved us</u>, even when we were dead in trespasses, made us alive together with Christ (by grace you have been saved), and raised us up together, in the heavenly places in Christ Jesus, that in the ages to come He might show the exceeding riches of His grace in <u>His kindness toward us</u> in Christ Jesus" (Eph 2:4-7).
