
"Pray for one another" - James 5:16 -

Luke, "the beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14), commends



the Bereans and holds them up as an excellent example to be followed: "These were more noble than those in Thessalonica, in that they received the word with all readiness of mind, and searched the scriptures daily, whether those things were so" (Acts 17:11). Webster's 1828 Dictionary defines the word "noble" as, "greatness or elevation of mind; dignified; being above everything that can dishonor reputation – as a noble mind. Of an excellent disposition; ready to receive truth (Acts 17)."


The Bereans received the word "not as the word of men, but as it is in truth, the word of God" (1 Thess 2:13). And they received it with all readiness of mind. As newborn babes, they eagerly desired the sincere milk of the word so that they could learn, grow and mature in their newfound faith (1 Pet 2:2). Like Job, the faithful servant of old, they "esteemed the words of His mouth more than [their] necessary food" (Job 23:12). So, when they heard "the word of God preached by Paul at Berea" (Acts 17:13), they earnestly ate them up, which (like Jeremiah) brought joy and rejoicing to their hearts (Jer 15:16).

The noble Bereans also searched the scriptures daily. They understood the importance of feeding on the word of God on a regular, consistent basis. As our Lord taught when He walked this earth: "It is written, Man shall not live by bread [physical food] alone, but by every word that proceeds out of the mouth of God" (Mt 4:4). Like the Psalmist, they exclaimed, "O how I love Thy law! It is my meditation all the day" (Ps 119:97). The study of God's word became a priority for them and His testimonies were their delight as well as their counselors (Ps 119:24). Through the word, they received godly guidance and divine direction. As the Psalmist rightly observed: "Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path" (Ps 119:105).

Finally, the noble Bereans did not take anything at face value. They even checked out the preaching of the Apostle Paul to see whether it was so. They heard the word gladly, and received it with all readiness of mind. But then, they wisely referred to

the standard of truth (Jn 17:17) – the authority of God's word (2 Tim 3:16-17) - to verify and validate what was being taught. This is a commendable and essential practice for you and me to emulate. As the scripture says: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth" (2 Tim 2:15). "Thy word is true from the beginning: and every one of Thy righteous judgments endures forever" (Ps 119:160). Amen.

Most importantly, the Bereans understood that serious, consistent study of the scriptures is able to make one wise unto salvation. As Paul told young Timothy: "From childhood you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith which is in Christ Jesus (2 Tim 3:15). And "faith cometh by hearing, and hearing by the word of God" (Rom 10:17). Our souls are purified when we obey the truth of God's word (Jn 17:17; 1 Pet 1:22). And we are born again ... through the word of God which lives and abides forever" (1 Pet 1:23). "Forever, O Lord, Thy word is settled in heaven" (Ps 119:89). Amen. — Terry Schmidt &


