Soothing Shade? or Destructive Darkness?



About 20 years ago, the trees beside our house had to be cut down. Initially, they had provided welcomed beauty and enjoyable shade from the hot sun. But through the years, they had become unsightly and overgrown. Their ever-spreading foliage had for years effectively blocked the rays of the sun. But the darkness of their permanent shade prevented the grass from growing and even caused mold to form on the side of our house which made the wood siding rot. Had we not gotten rid of those trees, the damage to the yard and house would have continued to worsen.

Sin is a lot like those trees. At first, sin is often welcomed and enjoyable. But, through time, sin's ever-spreading influence begins to dominate our lives and it becomes ugly. "His own iniquities entrap the wicked man, and he is caught in the cords of his sin" (Pr 5:22). Unresolved sin drives a wedge in the relationship that God wants to have with us and that we so desperately need to have with Him. "Your iniquities have separated you from your God; and your sins have hidden His face from you, so that He will not hear" (Is 59:2).

Eventually, the permeating darkness of sin will inhibit any measure of spiritual growth and the inner man begins to mold, decay, and eventually rot. At that point, they "walk in the futility of their mind [perverseness; moral depravity; devoid of truth], having their understanding darkened, being alienated from the life of God, because of the ignorance that is in them, because of the hardening of their heart [*see* Hebrews 3:12-14]; who, being past feeling [calloused; apathetic], have given themselves over to licentiousness [unbridled lust; unrestrained indulgence], to work all uncleanness [moral impurity] with greediness [avarice; covetousness]" (Eph 4:17-19). Not a pretty picture.

Just like getting rid of those trees prevented further damage to our house and yard, getting rid of unresolved sin will keep us from moral rot and spiritual decay. Jesus said: "I am the light of the world. He who follows Me shall not walk in darkness, but shall have the light of life" (Jn 8:12). As we walk with God in faithful obedience, beholding the glory of the Lord, we will be "transformed into the same image from glory to glory, just as by the Spirit of the Lord" (2 Cor 3:16-18). When we consistently turn to God, the healing, life-giving light will shine through from the Son...and transform our lives into His likeness! (Romans 8:29; 12:1-2). — **Terry Schmidt** \ll
