Eclipsing Jesus

Back in the early 1980's, Betty & I attended a Teacher's Workshop hosted by one of the larger con-

gregations of the Lord's church in Connecticut. The workshop was well organized, discussing a lot of helpful information and demonstrating various educational tools, along with effective teaching techniques. One of the sessions that made a substantial impression on me (which I still remember more than 40 years later), was the use of a lowtech flannel board. Remember them?

The flannel board lesson that left a lasting imprint on my mind was simply a picture of an artist's rendition of Jesus. Then, like a jig-saw puzzle, pictures of things occurring during a person's week were placed over the picture. These would include things like taking care of the routine necessities of life, hours spent at work or school, time spent watching TV, engaging in recreational activities, enjoying hobbies, etc. Before long, when adding picture after picture, Jesus was totally obscured or eclipsed.

Using this simple illustration, the lesson to be learned becomes clearly obvious and is easily understood. If we are not careful, Jesus can be completely crowded out of our daily lives. If the Lord is not intentionally made a priority, the business and "busy-ness" of life can consume all of our time and leave no room for Jesus. As disciples of Christ who desire to serve Him faithfully, we <u>must</u> *take* time and *make* time for Jesus.

To make this happen on a consistent basis with habitual regularity, we need to understand that doing this is essential to our Christian growth and spiritual well-being. It is vitally important that we spend quality time communing with the Lord and cultivating our souls. Specifically, this will mean quality time spent daily with the Lord in prayer (Mt 26:41; Eph 6:18; Phil 4:6; Col 4:2; 1 Thess 5:17), as well as a significant amount of time spent studying the Bible and feeding on the word of God (Mt 4:4; Rom 10:17; 2 Tim 2:15; 1 Pet 2:2; 2 Pet 3:18).


A major key to the successful application and permanent implementation of these important spiritual disciplines is *awareness* (Mt 26:41; Eph 5:15-17). Tell-tale signs that we are being side-tracked or getting off-track will be realized and recognized by an acute sense of spiritual hunger (Mt 5:6; 1 Cor 3:1-3; Heb 5:12-14), along with an unwelcomed increase in the "works of the flesh" (Gal 5:19-21; Eph 4:30; 1 Thess 5:19).

An effective antidote or solution to this undesirable condition is: "You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mk 12:30). The fidelity, constancy and intensity of this kind of love will keep us focused, committed, and on-track in our Christian walk (2 Cor 5:14; Col 3:1-4; Heb 12:1-2; 1 Jn 5:19). And, this keen spiritual awareness will prevent us from allowing the business and "busy-ness" of life to overtake us, crowd-out and eclipse the Lord Jesus Christ (Mt 6:33; Col 1:17-18). —Terry Schnidt \swarrow
