### Honoring the Holiness of God and Respecting the Authority of His Commands

Throughout the centuries, man has had the persistent propensity to try to bring God down to his level. Perhaps some remember the 1977 movie, "Oh, God!" which starred George Burns—a casually dressed, wise-cracking, "fun guy"—as God. His flippantly amusing portrayal of our heavenly Father in this movie may have been entertaining to some but, to the faithful Christian, it was blatantly disrespectful and even blasphemous.

We serve a sovereign God who is almighty and is *holy*. His name is to be revered and respected at all times. *"Thou shalt not take the name of the Lord thy God in vain; for the Lord will not hold him guiltless that taketh His name in vain"* (Ex 20:7). To take the Lord's name in vain means to use God's name in a way that is disrespectful or dishonoring. This would include using God's name as a curse word, taking a false oath, or using it as a cover for evil deeds. Most are familiar with what has come to be known as "The Lord's Prayer," which says in part, "*hallowed* be thy name" (Mt 6:9). To *hallow* means "to be consecrated, venerated and kept holy." This word is the direct *opposite* of that which is irreverent and profane.

It is not for us to bring God down to our level, nor try to make Him in "our image." After all, He is God! . . . and we are not. It would be in our best interest to acknowledge and appreciate the fact that God's thoughts and His ways are much higher than ours (Is 55:8-9). Therefore, He is always to be humbly revered and highly exalted. "For thus saith the High and Lofty One who inhabits eternity, whose name is Holy: 'I dwell in the high and holy place, with him who has a contrite and humble spirit, to revive the spirit of the humble, and to revive the heart of the contrite ones'" (Is 57:15). As our dear sister Hannah affirmed in her humble heartfelt prayer: "There is none holy like the Lord, for there is none besides You, nor is there any rock like our God!" (1 Sam 2:2). Her sincere words reflect the incomparable holiness of Jehovah God, along with the overall strength and ample protection that only He can provide.

Honoring the holiness of God will include faithful loving obedience to His commands. As the Lord Himself taught: *"If you love Me, keep My commandments"* (Jn 14:15). And again, *"If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word"* . . . *"He who does <u>not</u> love Me does <u>not</u> keep My words"* (Jn 14:23-24). This kind of loving devotion is founded *upon* and grounded *in* a genuine respect and firm acknowledgement of God's divine *authority*. The Lord said, *"All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth"* (Mt 28:18). How much authority? <u>All</u>! Where? In <u>heaven</u> and on <u>earth</u>! That's pretty much "all inclusive," isn't it? Totally comprehensive!

Honoring the holiness of God will result in respecting the authority of His commands. Respecting the authority of His commands will result in faithful loving obedience to those commands. This is extremely important, as failure to obey the will of God can have serious consequences and place our soul's salvation in jeopardy. As the Lord plainly taught during His earthly ministry: "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Mt 7:21). "Now may the God of peace who brought up our Lord Jesus from the dead, that great Shepherd of the sheep, through the blood of the everlasting covenant, make vou complete in every good work to do His will, working in you what is well pleasing in His sight, through Jesus Christ, to whom be glory for ever and ever. Amen." (Heb 13:20-21).
