True Worth

In September 2013 Forbes Magazine released its "Richest People in America" rankings. At the top of the list are Bill Gates, whose net worth is 72 billion and Warren Buffett, with a net worth of 58.5 billion. Others on the list, coming in with lesser amounts, were equally impressive. But as impressive as these figures may be, they pale in comparison to the value of just one soul.

Jesus gets to the heart of the matter in Luke 12:15 when He says: "Take heed and beware of covetousness, for one's life does not consist in the abundance of the things he possesses." While important and impressive to society, material possessions and social status do not determine a man's identity, define his purpose, or reveal his true worth before Almighty God. There is something deeper, more important and more meaningful.

In Matthew 16:26, Jesus asks a powerful and penetrating question: "For what profit is it to a man if he gains the whole world, and loses his own soul? Or what will a man give in exchange for his soul?" Jesus' words confirm the truth that one's soul is worth far more than all of the wealth, power and status this world can offer. The inspired Psalmist assures us that the value of one's soul is inestimable and cannot be purchased with money.

"Those who trust in their wealth and boast in the multitude of their riches, none of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him—for the redemption of their souls is costly...." (Psalm 49:6-8).

We get some idea of the value God places on our souls when we consider the extent to which He was willing to go in sending His Son to die to redeem us (Rom 5:8; 1 Tim 2:5-6; 1 Jn 4:9-10). Because of God's tremendous love for us, and because of what Christ did for us on the cross, we can rejoice that we "have now been returned to the Shepherd and Overseer of [our] souls" (1 Pet 2:25).
