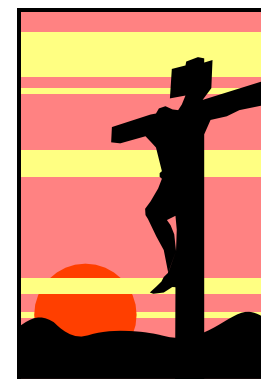

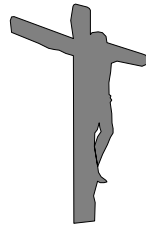

## A Fitting Memorial

In nearly every community across this nation there are monuments honoring certain notable individuals and memorials commemorating various historical events. These shrines and landmarks seek to honor our heritage and perpetuate the legacy of noble acts of greatness. They are meant to be viewed with gratitude, thoughtfulness and respect.

By definition, a memorial is that which causes us to remember; "of, relating to, or being in memory" (*thefreedictionary.com*). And the greatest memorial of all is the one our Lord instituted the night before His crucifixion when He said, "Do this in remembrance of Me" (Luke 22:19; 1 Cor 11:24-24). When we share in the Lord's Supper together, we are obeying this specific command of our Lord and are engaged in a most meaningful part of our worship.

As He partook of the Passover meal with His disciples, Jesus provided us with emblems representing His body and his blood (Mt 26:26-28; Mk 14:22-24). The Apostle Paul lovingly reminded the Corinthian church of this: "The cup of blessing which we bless, is it not the communion of the blood of Christ? The bread which we break, is it not the communion of the body of Christ? For we being many are one bread, and one body: for we are all partakers of that one bread." (1 Cor 10:16-17). When we partake of these emblems during the Lord's Supper, we are to think deeply about what they represent and seriously consider the profound significance of this memorial with gratitude, thoughtfulness and respect.

Until the Lord comes again and we are in His presence (1 Cor 11:26), we can be thankful that He gave us this meaningful memorial which causes us to remember His life, His death, His resurrection and the tremendous sacrifice made for our salvation.
