

Consider Your Ways!



The exiled Jews who returned to Jerusalem, after 70 years of Babylonian captivity, had engaged in the noble task of rebuilding the temple, which was destroyed by Nebuchadnezzar in 586 BC. In two years, they completed the foundation, but then faced strong opposition from their enemies which disrupted this important work and brought it to a halt. The people then devoted their time and energies to their homes and personal comfort, leaving the work of the temple undone for 14 years. In 520 BC, through the preaching of Haggai the prophet, God exposes their indifference and negligence.

“Thus speaks the LORD of hosts, saying: ‘This people says, “The time has not come, the time that the LORD’s house should be built.”’” Then the word of the LORD came by Haggai the prophet, saying, “Is it time for you yourselves to live in your paneled houses [in comfort and luxury], and this temple to lie in ruins?” Now therefore, thus says the LORD of hosts: Consider your ways!” (Haggai 1:2-5).

Consider your ways! Very good and wise counsel to be sure. We need to be attentive and aware of the fact that, as sinful human beings, we can become easily distracted and begin to stray & wander from the truth (Jas 5:19-20). The ever-present possibility exists that our hearts can be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin, we can lose our faith, and be in dreadful danger of actually departing from the living God! (Heb 3:12-14). At these critical times, our heavenly Father will lovingly, but determinedly, intervene in order to get our attention and bring us back to where we need to be.

This is exactly what had happened to the Psalmist in Psalm 119 when he gratefully proclaimed: “Before I was afflicted, I went astray, but now I keep Your word” (v. 67) ... “It is good for me that I have been afflicted, that I may learn Your statutes” (v. 71) ... “I know, O LORD, that Your judgments are right, and that in faithfulness you have

afflicted me” (v. 75). Our gracious God will always confront and challenge us when we stray from His way and are endangering our souls. Therefore, “do not despise the chastening of the LORD, nor be discouraged when you are rebuked by Him,” because He administers this discipline “for our profit, that we may be partakers of His holiness” (Heb 12:5-10).

But our heavenly Father will not even need to get to the point where He must discipline us **if** we consistently and conscientiously consider our ways. In fact, we are commanded to do this each “first day of the week” when we partake of the Lord’s Supper. “But let a man examine himself, and so let him eat of the bread and drink of the cup” (1 Cor 11:28). As you live the Christian life, you are to “examine yourselves as to whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves” (2 Cor 13:5). Examine ... test ... consider your ways! On a regular basis, may we faithfully endeavor to do some deep personal introspection – some serious soul-searching – to ensure that our lives are in harmony with God’s word. — *Terry Schmidt* ✍
