The Scribes and Pharisees

Throughout Jesus' earthly ministry, He had continuous confrontations with the scribes and Pharisees. The Jewish scribes, or "lawyers" as they were sometimes called, were highly educated men whose professional occupation was the detailed, systematic study of the Law of Moses, along with its analysis and interpretation. The majority of the scribes belonged to the religious sect of the Pharisees, who recognized and agreed with their interpretations of the Mosaic law.

The prominent Jewish sects at the time of Christ were the Pharisees, Sadducees and the Essenes. But the Pharisees were the strictest and most orthodox religious sect, and the most influential. The name Pharisee means "the separated ones." They were legalistic elitists who considered themselves to be near flawless in keeping the Law of Moses, and therefore, more righteous and religious than others. The scribes and the Pharisees were the religious leaders of their day, who loved the "chief seats in the synagogues" (Mt 23:6), as well as the praise and recognition of men (Mt 23:5, 7).

The Lord Jesus Christ reserved some of His harshest criticism for these meticulous law keepers, calling them "hypocrites" (Mt 15:7). This word has roots in the Greek plays, where the same person could play the good guy *and* the bad guy, simply by wearing a different mask. A hypocrite is one who puts on a false appearance for others, acting in a way he never intends to become. Their false outward show openly contradicts their true inner self. While the Pharisees would masquerade as spiritual super-men, deeply devout, and reverently religious – in reality they were corrupt to the core. Early on, Jesus had warned His disciples about them saying, "*Beware of the leaven of the Pharisees, which is hypocrisy*" (Lk 12:1).

In Matthew 23, the Lord publicly denounced them saying, "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you cleanse the outside of the cup and dish, but inside they are full of extortion and selfindulgence (v. 25). "Woe to you, scribes and Pharisees, hypocrites! For you are like whitewashed tombs which indeed appear beautiful outwardly, but inside are full of dead men's bones and all uncleanness. Even so you also outwardly appear righteous to men, but inside you are full of hypocrisy and iniquity" (vv. 27-28). "Serpents, brood of vipers! How can you escape the condemnation of hell?" (v. 33). Indeed! Jesus had previously said, "Assuredly, I say to you that tax collectors and harlots enter the kingdom of God before you!" (Mt 21:31).

Because Jesus refused to be controlled or bound by their interpretations of the law, or their manmade traditions, the scribes and Pharisees fiercely opposed Him. They saw Jesus as a real threat to their power, prominence and prestige. Throughout His earthly ministry, these religious leaders were His most critical and determined opponents. This would ultimately lead to their playing an important role in bringing about His crucifixion. As Matthew 12:14 records, "Then the Pharisees went out and took counsel against Him, how they might destroy Him." And ultimately, Jesus would respond, "Father, forgive them; for they know not what they do" (Lk 23:34). You see, "in due time, Christ died for the ungodly" (Rom 5:6).
