## Not By Might!

Zechariah 4:6 is a profound and impactful verse, carrying a powerful message that has resonated through the ages:



"'Not by might nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord of Hosts" (the Lord Almighty). The word "might" often has reference to military strength or physical force, while "power" can denote personal influence or authority. In a world that highly values these attributes, this declaration challenges the prevailing notion that success is achieved through sheer force or human effort.

In its context, Zechariah 4:6 is concerned with the completion of the temple in Jerusalem and the restoration of the Jewish community after 70 years in exile. The Israelites needed to be reminded that their success in rebuilding the temple and, by extension, their restoration as a nation, was not solely dependent on their own strength or resources. The Lord is making known that these things will not be achieved through human strength or political power, but through the Spirit of God. This is a divine reminder that His purposes are accomplished, not by human efforts alone, but by divine intervention and spiritual empowerment (2 Chron 32:7-8).

This verse emphasizes the utter futility of relying solely on our human abilities, and the real necessity of relying on God (Pr 28:26). This message is echoed throughout the Bible, reinforcing the idea that spiritual and moral victories are achieved through faith and reliance on God, rather than by physical force or human ingenuity (Pr 21:30-31). This teaching is a reminder of the importance of the Holy Spirit's influence in our lives. The Spirit of God encourages believers to seek guidance, strength, and empowerment through prayer and the word of God, rather than relying on our own capabilities (Pr 3:5-6). Success in any spiritual endeavor is rooted in dependence on God rather than selfsufficiency (2 Cor 3:5; Gal 5:16-18). Therefore, we must acknowledge our human limitations and trust in God's power to work through them as we labor in His service (2 Cor 12:9-10).

Zechariah 4:6 serves as a reminder that, in the face of daunting tasks and seemingly insurmountable obstacles, a determined faith in God is essential (Heb 11:6). The verse calls for a trusting reliance

on God's divine power rather than depending on mere human efforts. It calls for a genuine humility, an unwavering faith, and an honest recognition of human strength. It reassures believers that true success and fulfillment are found in aligning with the Lord's Spirit and purposes, as expressed in the word of God (Joshua 1:8). It encourages believers to look beyond their own abilities and to place their full trust in God for guidance, strength, and success (Ps 119:1-3; 105).

This message is particularly relevant for believers today, reminding us that spiritual work requires spiritual resources. God's divine guidance and support are more important than our own capabilities and resources (Ps 32:8; Is 41:10). Like Israel of old, we often need to be reminded that our efforts, though seemingly small and feeble, are part of a larger divine plan. As we face daunting challenges, whether in God's service, our personal life, or community endeavors, we can be assured that, with God's help, even the most overwhelming tasks can be accomplished (Phil 4:13). As we navigate the challenges of life, this verse remains a beacon of hope and a call to faith, reminding us that our Christian growth and spiritual victories come, "'Not by might, nor by power, but by My Spirit,' says the Lord."
