The Importance of Study



"So, teach us to number our days, that we may apply our hearts unto wisdom" (Ps 90:12). It has been said that time is a great indicator of what we give our hearts to. In comparison to all that we spend time doing during the week (much of it necessary, of course), how much time do we spend reading and studying God's word? This is an important question which demands an honest answer. Jesus emphasized the importance of God's word in our lives when he stressed that man lives by every word that proceeds from the mouth of God (Matt 4:4). Because God's word is our spiritual food, providing needed strength and nourishment for the soul, we need to feed on it daily. And this is not optional if we want to remain strong in Christ and grow in our faith.

Scripture instructs, "Wise people store up knowledge" (Pr 10:14), and "He who walks with wise men will be wise" (Pr 13:20). We can "walk with wise men" through their writings. Many excellent books and periodicals by our brethren can be easily obtained. By reading articles either online or in brotherhood publications, we can greatly benefit from the many combined years of wisdom and experience gleaned by our faithful brothers and sisters in Christ. Through reading, we can reap the benefits of years of Bible study and a college or university education. For some of us, this may be the only way we will be able to gain this knowledge—through reading and personal study! As Mark Twain has rightly observed: "The man who does not read has no advantage over the man who cannot read."

"Give instruction to a wise man, and he will be still wiser; teach a just man, and he will increase in learning" (Pr 9:9). God's inspired word is "profitable for doctrine [teaching; instruction], for reproof [conviction; showing us what is wrong in our lives], for correction ["straightening up"; restoration to a right state], for instruction in righteousness [training; disciplinary correction; teaching us how to live right]: that the man of God may be

perfect [complete], thoroughly furnished [completely equipped] unto all good works" (2 Tim 3:16-17). God's word equips us for the work He has prepared for us to do (Eph 2:10). The word of God gives us practical guidance and divine direction for living a godly life (Ps 119:105).

As Christians, we are admonished to "grow in grace, and in the knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ (2 Peter 3:18) and to "let the word of Christ dwell in [us] richly in all wisdom" (Colossians 3:16). This does not just happen! In fact, it cannot and will not happen unless we make the time to read and study God's word on a regular basis. As the scriptures admonish: "Study to show thyself approved unto God, a workman that needeth not to be ashamed, rightly dividing the word of truth!" (2 Tim 2:15).
