The True Essence of Worship



At its core, worship is a knowledgeable heartfelt response to the divine character and attributes of God. Psalm 95:6 says it well, "Oh come, let us worship and bow down; let us kneel before the Lord our Maker." This verse encapsulates the very essence of worship. It is an act done in humility, with a proper regard and respect for God's majesty, authority and sovereignty. More than a mere ritualistic act, worship is an open acknowledgment of who God is – our Creator, our Sustainer, and our Redeemer.

In the Old Testament Hebrew scriptures, the word most commonly translated as worship is *shachah*, which means "to bow down," "prostrate oneself," "humbly beseech," or "do reverence." This has reference to a physical act of submission and reverence — expressing honor, adoration and deep respect towards God. In the Greek New Testament, the most common word for worship is *proskyneō*. This term means "to kiss towards one in reverence" or "to prostrate oneself in homage." This too, reflects an act of deep respect and profound adoration towards God. Both of these words emphasize showing reverence, submission, and honor — whether through a physical posture — or through one's attitude towards God.

Genuine worship has its roots in love and devotion. The word devotion and its derivations can be defined as: (1) Ardent, often selfless affection and dedication, as to a person or principle; earnest attachment to a cause, person, etc. (2) Religious ardor or zeal; piety; profound dedication, esp. to religion; consecration. Devotion can include feelings of ardent love or a strong positive emotion of regard and affection for another. It also carries the meaning of a firm, dedicated commitment to some purpose – the act of binding yourself (intellectually and/or emotionally) to a course of action with a willingness to serve (thefreedictionary.com).

Devotion is synonymous with dedication and commitment, and has its roots in words like loyalty, faithfulness and allegiance. And these words have

their roots in love. Scripture affirms that "we love Him because He first loved us" (1 Jn 4:19). And when you "love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength" (Mk 12:30), your loyalty and allegiance will be to Him only and you will be ever faithful in His service (Mt 6:33; 1 Cor 15:58), and steadfast & sincere in your worship (Jn 4:24). We will echo the determined words of the psalmist: "My heart is steadfast, O God, my heart is steadfast; I will sing and give praise!" (Ps 57:7).

So, out of our grateful response of love for God and what He has done for us through Christ, grows a solid allegiance to God which produces an unwavering devotion to Him, which produces willing obedience, acceptable worship and selfless service. Even if this Christian duty should include sacrifice and suffering, the devout Christian will not be discouraged nor deterred from rendering faithful obedience and devoted worship to his loving God (Ps 112:7-8). — Terry Schmidt &
