Let Us Reason Together



Logical objective reasoning seems to be rather scarce these days among many of our institutions of higher learning and society at large. Subjective, irrational feelings now tend to set the agenda and rule the day. My, how much we've lost!

Reasoning involves (1) "the power of the mind to think, understand and form judgments by a process of logic [strict and formal principles of validity and soundness]; (2) to accurately explain or adequately justify an action or event" (Merriam-Webster). To assist in making the important decisions and judgments of life, we need to appeal to and comply with a standard [a thing used as a norm, model, or measure in comparative evaluations]. For example, a ruler is the accepted standard for linear measurement. Should there be a difference of opinion as to the actual length of a recently caught fish, a ruler [the standard] will (or should) settle the issue. A calibrated scale is the accepted standard for measuring weight, and so on.

Of course, our standard in matters of faith and the spiritual realm is the word of God (Jn 17:17; Jn 16:13). As the Psalmist proclaims: "The entirety of Your word is truth, and every one of Your righteous judgments endures forever ... for all Your commandments are <u>righteousness</u>" (Ps 119:160, 172). The Apostle Paul didn't depend on his communication skills or intellectual expertise when he reasoned with the Jews in Thessalonica. "Then Paul, as his custom was, went in to them, and for three Sabbaths reasoned with them from the Scriptures" (Acts 17:2; also 18:4 & 18:19). Apollos also, "an eloquent man and mighty in the Scriptures" ... "vigorously refuted the Jews publicly, showing from the Scriptures that Jesus is the Christ" (Acts 18:24-28). Both Paul and Apollos appealed to the standard—the authority of God's word, as should we. God's holy, inspired word needs to be our final authority when it comes to salvation, the faith and practice of our religion, and the way we conduct ourselves and live our lives.

The answers to all man's relevant questions and the solutions to man's spiritual problems, along with the direction he needs to live a purposeful, abundant life are to be found in God's word. "All Scripture is given by inspiration of God, and is profitable for doctrine [teaching; instruction], for reproof [conviction; persuasion; rebuke], for correction [improvement of life & character], for instruction in righteousness" [cultivation of mind & morals] (2 Tim 3:16). Verse 17 goes on to say that God's word makes man complete (without it we are incomplete), and thoroughly equips him for every good work [God's work – 1 Cor 15:58: Eph 2:10].

Therefore, "Let us reason together," saith the LORD! (Isaiah 1:18). — Terry Schmidt \mathbb{Z}
