The Law Of Christ



In Galatians 6:2 the Apostle Paul says: "Bear one another's burdens, and so [or, in this way] fulfill the law of Christ. The law of Christ can be simply defined and generally understood as the teachings of Christ. And prominent in that teaching is the topic of love. Jesus identified the first and greatest of all commandments as, "You shall love the Lord vour God with all vour heart, with all vour soul. with all your mind, and with all your strength. This is the first commandment. And the second, like it. is this: You shall love your neighbor as yourself. There is no other commandment greater than these." (Mark 12:30-31).

Within the family of God, Jesus commands us to love one another (John 15:17). And we are to love one another as He has loved us (John 15:12). And how was that? He loved us so much that He gave His life for us! (John 10:11: 15:13). As the Apostle John observes: "In this the love of God was manifested toward us, that God has sent His only begotten Son into the world, that we might live through Him" (1 John 4:9). "By this we know love, because He laid down His life for us. And we also ought to lay down our lives for the brethren" (1 John 3:16).

There may be a time when we will be tested to the extreme of laying down our lives for the brethren. But, in most instances, bearing one another's burdens requires something much less demanding—a phone call expressing care & concern, a note or card of encouragement, a personal visit, simply listening as a brother or sister shares their burden, praying together, or offering to help in some way. Everyday life is lived mostly in the "ordinary" and is made up of "little things." But - these little things matter!

In Galatians 5:13, Paul exhorts: "Through love serve one another." This unselfish, self-sacrificing love is rooted in Christ our Lord and emanates from Him. "In this is love, not that we loved God, but that He loved us and sent His Son to be the propitiation for our sins" (1 John 4:10). "We love

Him, because He first loved us" (1 John 4:19. "For the love of Christ constrains [compels; motivates] us" (2 Corinthians 5:14).

It is Christ's love for us, our response of love for Him, and our love for our brothers & sisters in the body of Christ that motivates us to serve one another. "Beloved, if God so loved us, we also ought to love one another" (1 John 4:11). And it is through this loving service that we bear one another's burdens. And it is in bearing one another's burdens that we fulfill the law of Christ. So, "beloved, let us love one another, for love is of God!" (1 John 4:7). — Terry Schmidt &
