Feeling Like A Failure

For most of us, there are those dark periods in our lives when nothing seems to be going right and we become disillusioned and discouraged. We realize how much we fall short and are oft reminded of our many shortcomings. We may feel that we are inadequate to the task at hand and just don't measure up. Our noble goals have not been achieved and things just haven't turned out the way we planned.

Aside from situations and circumstances beyond our control, mistakes happen, errors in judgment occur, and at times we just "blow it" and really make a mess of things. At times like this, we may feel that even God does not love us. Or, at the very least, He is probably very disappointed with us and quite possibly pretty angry at us.

Peter may have wrestled with similar feelings after he had denied the Lord three times. He had done the unthinkable and, he may have thought, the unpardonable. He had done that which he had confidently sworn he would never do (Mt 26:31-35). He had failed in a most glaring and disappointing manner. The Lord had placed confidence in him and, at a critical moment, he had let Him down (Mt 26:69-75).

It was over. Most likely, Peter did not even consider himself to be an apostle anymore and went back to fishing. But the Lord saw to it that Peter be included in resurrection message: "He is risen! He is not here. See the place where they laid him. But go tell His disciples—and Peter—that He is going on before you into Galilee; there you will see Him as He said to you" (Mk 16:6-7).

The important thing for us to remember in all of this is that, although Peter may have felt that the Lord was through with him, Jesus did not give up on Peter. In fact, God used this failure to mold Peter into the great servant he would later become. Peter's prideful, self-reliant spirit was now gone, being replaced by a broken spirit of deep contrition and genuine humility. The Lord forgave Peter and he was never the same again!

Peter's story is encouraging and reminds us of just how much God loves us. Like Peter, God will never give up on us, "For He Himself has said, 'I will never leave thee, nor forsake thee" (Heb 13:5). God sees us at our best. And He sees us at our worst. And—amazingly—He still loves us! (even when we really don't love ourselves all that much).

As we experience this divine agape love and the forgiveness that comes with it, we (like Peter) are energized and motivated to serve the Lord with wholehearted devotion. "I delight to do Thy will. O my God: yea, Thy law is within my heart" (Psalm 40:8). No matter how disappointing our performance may be from time to time, as long as we are faithful to God and He has first place in our hearts, we will never be regarded as a failure (Mt 6:33: Mk 12:30). — Terry Schmidt &
